Discussion Guide: When Everything Changes

Open: Allow people to share a defining moment from their life.

"Defining Moment": Occurrence setting a new course for life; a pivotal event. Defining moments are experiences that bring us to a point of change. They may be perceived as either positive or negative.

- Was the defining moment you shared "positive" or "negative?"
- Can you think of a defining moment that fits the opposite description? What the difference? Can negative experiences, define life positively?

1. Defining moments are either "appointments" or "disappointments."Sometimes God *disappoints* us so we will join His *appointment* for us.

- How were the crowds disappointed by Jesus appointment as King?
 What were they expecting? What was a surprise?
 Would Jesus' have been more loving and kind to have met people's kingdom expectations?
- How do God's defining moments in our lives disappoint, or surprise, us?

2. Defining moments may happen while we are "at the tomb." Agree, disagree, discuss:

- How does "facing death down" free us to truly live?
- How does Hebrews 2:14-15 inform this show down?

3. Defining moments may happen when we sacrifice something very valuable.

- Has letting go of something very valuable to you (willingly or unwillingly) helped you define your life values and priorities? Share.
- Agree, disagree, discuss: "We only value what we're spent for."
- How can "keeping" be a moment that defines our life negatively?
 Keeping Clutching for self.
 - How might we put ourselves in the role of Judas by hanging onto stuff, or people, that we should be sacrificing to Jesus?
